PCEC is not only the national leader in providing prostate health assessments for men in all stages of the disease; it is also the national leader in increasing awareness and education on prostate disease. Our national SET the PACE Event Series is integral to this mission. Featured activities are diverse including runs, golf tournaments, health conferences, etc. In fact, SET the PACE is the only national series that allows local partners to retain funds, thereby creating a greater impact in the local community.
